# in Worship


The Christian Year calendar is our guide for worship and Christian faith formation. The beginning of the Christian year is the season of Advent, approximately four weeks before Christmas Day, and continues with special days and seasons following the life of Christ and the mission of the church. There are two major cycles in the Christian Year. One is the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle (February 14 is the final Sunday of Epiphany, also known as Transfiguration Day) that is focused upon Christmas and the mission of the church. The other is the Lent-Easter-Pentecost cycle that has Easter, celebrated this year on April 04, as its focus. In the three year process of reading Scripture, we are in the second year. Year B focuses on the Gospel accountings of Mark and John more than any other year. We remember the beginning of Lent is Ash Wednesday, the next of the liturgical events in the life of the Church. From the blasts of the shofar reminding us to heed the warning call and turn our lives around (repent), the imposition of the ashes on our hand or head, our observance of Ash Wednesday, February 17 is a tradition for St. Paul Church. Due to the pandemic our gathering will be virtual this year, with worship being streamed at 7:00 p.m. from the Sanctuary. We will hear words of scripture, songs of faith sung, and hear the message that, although we have failed, there is forgiveness and another chance for living the life to which God has called each of us. Elsewhere in this issue are words of instruction on how you may receive ashes to be used as part of worship that night, or whenever you choose to observe the ritual. We pay tribute to the practice of scouting on February 28, with Scouting Ministries Sunday. We invite any in the congregation who are Scouts to contact the office so that your name might lifted up as part of our service. February is also Black History month and a wide variety of culturally appropriate music will be offered in worship at both PianoSide (released on YouTube each week at 8:00 a.m.) and *LiveStream* (live on FaceBook each week at 10:00 a.m. and later on YouTube) as has been our tradition for over 25 years. We are appreciative of the ministry through music of the many volunteers and friends that continue to bring meaning and encouragement to each service. We all long for the day that we might worship together in person.


