For my Eagle Scout Service Project, I am partnering with our Saint Paul CDC to create two raised garden beds. We are currently asking for donations to help support the project. Funds will be used to purchase the materials to build the garden beds, mulch, soil and plants,

A Thank You to Belinda Johnson and Her Family

Belinda Johnson provided memorial funds received for her husband, Warren Johnson, to pay for AED supplies to update Saint Paul's AED device. AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) are portable, life-saving devices designed to treat people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest, a medical condition in which the heart stops beating suddenly and unexpectedly. AEDs periodically need new pads and batteries to keep them operating properly. The machine itself walks you through the potentially life saving steps.

We thank Belinda and Myleen, Johnathan, Samuel and Elijah for providing this generous donation in memory of Warren.

In case of cardiac emergency the AED machine is located near the church office. First aid kits and automatic blood pressure cuffs will be in the same location.

BART Update—Name Change


