"Not all who wander are lost"

from "The Fellowship of the Ring," by JRR Tolkien

The word wander conjures many images for me: open spaces, paths with endpoints yet to be discovered, beaches, and downtown neighborhoods all come to mind when I think about what it means to wander. I associate other words with wandering: exploration, discovery, and insight are just a few. In this season of Lent, you will find us using the word wander as a thematic link, inviting us to a season of exploration and discovery. Tolkien wrote, "not all who wander are lost," and I think these are appropriate words for the season of Lent, when we hear stories of Jesus in the desert and traveling with his disciples.

This phrase from Tolkien about wandering is nestled within the verse of a poem,

All that is gold does not glitter: not all who wander are lost. The old that is strong does not wither. Deep roots are not reached by the frost.

I find these words to be so appropriate for us in the Midwest as we awaken from winter and look towards Spring. Just as our favorite perennial plants return after winter because of their deep roots, our faith journey helps us to be strong on our discipleship path. I hope in this season of Lent you will join us for worship as we explore what it means to deepen our faith through wandering; through book studies that give opportunities for small group learning; and giving of ourselves through mission giving and this month's Undie Sunday. 


