

# PASTORAL PERSPECTIVE **Embrace.**

This word began nudging me during Lent. I found myself reading it, hearing it - it was a word of the week that grew into a month, and one that I did not choose. I decided that if this word had chosen me, perhaps my best course would be to . . . *embrace* both the word and what it means on the faith journey from Lent into Easter and beyond.

A quick word study reminded me that a physical embrace is often a warm hug, perhaps from someone who knows us very well - a longtime friend or a relative who has known us since childhood. Embrace can also be used to describe an enthusiastic acceptance or support of something new whether that be a change in tradition, diet, location, or weather.

During Lent, we have embraced the stories of God's love as demonstrated by the loving acts of Jesus' ministry of healing. We have embraced this path of love together - fasting to benefit UMCOR, welcoming Temple Israel and Bishop Wilson to our congregation, and by neighborly sharing of Valentines for Benson High School teachers & staff and undies for school kids.

In the Holy week scriptures, we hear the narrative of the holy embrace of Jesus. He embraces his journey toward Easter. The people who gather during the palm procession embrace him with their Hosannas. Jesus embraces his disciples during the Last Supper with nourishment far beyond what they could comprehend.

#### Proud to #BeUMC

A Note from Rev. Steph

For five years, I have volunteered with the Great Plains Conference board of Trustees, the last three as its president. It's been an unprecedented season for many reasons – but none more important than the negotiation of the terms for Kansas and Nebraska UM churches wishing to leave the denomination through what is called the "disaffiliation" process.

Throughout our history, the UMC has been known as a "big tent" denomination with great room for diversity. However, our international denomination has a governance system that can be difficult to navigate even on the best of days. At a 2019 General Conference special session, delegates voted to create a short exit timeframe for U.S. congregations who find it untenable to remain in a diverse denomination – known as "disaffiliation."

In our Great Plains Conference, the opportunity to disaffiliate closes at the end of April. To leave, churches must hold a Church Conference and vote with at least a 2/3 majority. Any Conference debts and two years forward of their mission shares must be paid. Individuals who wish to stay UMC members can transfer to the Conference rolls or to any other UMC until a new church is formed in their area.

While some in our immediate area have chosen to leave, the overwhelming majority of churches in our Conference have chosen to join Saint Paul Benson in proudly staying United Methodist.

Saint Paul Benson has no need to vote. We joined the Reconciling Congregation movement in 2019, confirming then to be part of the diverse and welcoming future that is the United Methodist Church.

What do we need to do now? Be on the lookout for visitors (both in person and online) who may need a new church home. Your warm greetings or online comments will make a difference! Saint Paul's history as a haven for seekers will continue to light the path in this critical time in the United Methodist Church.

# Holy Week Begins

**Palm Sunday, April 02:** To the faithful Jew, a mecca to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover in the Temple was the epitome of worship. Jesus knew this and went himself to proclaim God's kingdom being at hand. We remember the excitement of the crowd with brass at 10:00 and waving palms at all services.

Maundy Thursday, April o6: Holy Thursday is the Christian reenactment of the Passover feast that Jesus himself celebrated with the Twelve Disciples the eve of his arrest. As part of our Holy Communion celebration, we will observe a ritual of hand washing, following Christ's command to, "do this in remembrance of me." The Joy Bell Ringers will offer special music during this service beginning at 7:00 PM in the Sanctuary.

**Good Friday, April 07:** For Protestants, the observance of Good Friday is a most somber and solemn occasion. This powerful retelling of Christ's last hours will begin at 7:00 PM in the Sanctuary. Our worship will center round the power of the cross as we hear the words of the Saint Paul Youth ask, "Am I the one?"

Holy Saturday, April 08: We begin our time of worship with a reminder that Christ has not yet risen. The sacrament of Holy Communion offers us the chance to start anew in God's love for us as Christ's resurrection is announced. The service will begin at 5:00 PM in Roth Chapel.

Easter Day, April 09: Easter Sunday is the main reason why Christians keep Sunday, the first day of the week, as the primary day of religious observance. Easter serves as the great feast day and pinnacle of the Christian liturgical year. It is also the first day of the new season of the Great Fifty Days, or Eastertide, which runs from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. Our celebration of the resurrection will include communion observances at 8:00 and 10:00 AM. Bring your family and friends to worship at Saint Paul Benson!


