Financial News

As first reported to you in the May newsletter, the Administrative Executive Team continues to work with Saint Paul's clergy and staff to improve the financial stability of the church. Peeling back the layers of the budget and financial records has helped us gain an understanding of both our contractual obligations and operating expenses. In addition to payroll, Saint Paul has monthly bills to pay – just as you may have at home – including insurance, pensions, cleaning supplies, and utilities including electric, gas, water, internet, telephone and security system.

And, as in a regular household, unexpected expenses can put cashflow in a bind. Just last week, we received a bid to repair the air conditioning unit that cools the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Without this repair, the system can cool at only up to 50% capacity. It may get a bit warm during Sunday worship before the funds to pay for repairs are allocated.

We are currently running a monthly deficit of about \$14,000 between money received and expenses. We were fortunate to draw \$50,000 from the Saint Paul Foundation to help ease cashflow through the month of June. We have been able to find ways to save on some office/building-related expenses, and we are beginning to discuss what we can do to encourage the use of our building by outside organizations.

With the clergy team we have in place, we have hope for the future. You can help by supporting Saint Paul with regular prayers, and, if you are able, please consider an increase in giving.
