inWorship

As you receive this issue, we will already be readying ourselves for the third Sunday of Lent 2023. We know this time to be one of forty days of praying, fasting, and giving. Did you know that Lent actually ends at sundown of Holy Saturday, the Saturday of Easter weekend, which makes it forty-six days long? The Church has historically exempted Sunday's worship from Lent: six Sundays from forty-six days leaves us with the reminder of the forty days Jesus spent being tempted in the wilderness.

Sunday, March 03 will bring the music of guest organist, David Schack to our worship. Sunday, March 10 will be celebrated with our House Band.

Sunday, March 17 worship will be enhanced with music from the Joy Bells.

March 24, we remember the excitement of the crowd on Palm Sunday with organist, David Schack and the Solid Brass Quartet at 10:00 with waving palms.

Holy/Maundy Thursday is the Christian reenactment of the Passover feast that Jesus celebrated with the Twelve Disciples on the eve of his arrest. As part of the Sacrament of Holy Communion we will observe a ritual of hand washing, following Christ's mandate to, "do this in remembrance of me." The Joy Bell Ringers and organist, David Schack will offer special music during this service which begins at 7:00 p.m., March 28, in the Sanctuary.

For Protestants the observance of Good Friday, March 29 is a most somber and solemn occasion. This powerful retelling of Christ's last hours will begin at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary. Our worship will center round the power of the scriptural last words of Christ with members of the Saint Paul Youth offering readings underscored by music of The Choir with the Solid Brass Quartet.

Holy Saturday, March 30 reminds us that Christ has not yet risen through the hearing of a Messiah foretold by the prophets and writers of Biblical scriptures. The sacrament of Holy Communion offers us the chance to start anew in God's love for us as Christ's resurrection is announced. The service will begin at 5:00 p.m. in Roth Chapel.

The Festival of Easter, March 31, is the main reason why Christians keep Sunday, the first day of the week, as the primary day of religious observance. Easter serves as the great feast day and pinnacle of the Christian liturgical year. It is also the first day of the new season of the Great Fifty Days, or Eastertide, which runs from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. Our celebrations of the empty tomb will include the Sacrament of Holy Communion at 10:00 a.m. Guest organist, David Schack, will offer a thrilling 15minute prelude before the service. The Choir and Joy Bells will also lead in worship.

Bring your family and friends to celebrate at St. Paul. Holy Week, the culmination of our Lenten journey. The shofar blasts of Ash Wednesday continue to call us to pray, fast, give and return to God as we prepare to celebrate yet another Easter miracle.
