

"Words from the Beginning"...the theme that will guide our worship during this Advent 2024. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated **November 30/December 01**, the first weekend of Advent, with guest organist, David Schack at morning worship.

The second weekend of Advent, December 07/08, will be graced by music of our faithful Lorraine Hahn at evening worship.

December 14/15, the third Advent weekend, our Joy Bells and The Choir join in the Children's Ministries re-enactment of the Luke passage telling of Christ's birth, as part of 10:00 worship.

Any who find themselves suffering in body, mind or spirit are invited to join as we observe a service of Blue Christmas worship Wednesday afternoon, **December 18** at 3:00 p.m. in the Roth Chapel.

The 4th weekend of Advent will be observed with the traditional setting of Advent Lessons and Carols **December 21/22** in Chapel worship at 5:00 p.m. and the Sunday service at 10:00 a.m. with the Solid Brass and David Schack, organist.

We gather to celebrate **Christmas Eve** with two services of candles, carols, and communion, all in the beauty of the Saint Paul Sanctuary. The 5:00 and 7:30 services will include the singing of Malotte's "The Lord's Prayer" with The Choir leading the later worship. This rich tradition was established as collaboration between the Rev. Dr. Alva Clark and the Honorable Judge Walter Cropper in 1953. It will be the 71st consecutive year the beautiful melody has graced our worship.

As another year ends, we give thanks for the dedication and vibrant leadership offered by the many volunteers who grace the Music Ministry of St. Paul Church. Your perseverance and commitment make worship a true blessing from God!

From the Desk of . . . Rev. Marta Wheeler


Dear Saint Paul friends,
